THE JOURNEY OF A LIFETIME

On Sunday, September 25th, at the afternoon Cardinal baseball game, the journey of a lifetime came to a peaceful conclusion at Busch Stadium in downtown St. Louis. Earlier this year, starting off on April 8th in Bellingham, Washington, Darren O'Donnell started a bicycle tour of all 30 major league baseball stadiums. Darren is the cousin of our own Mike Roder, who has worked at Lafayette for 22 years. Darren bicycled over 10,000 miles on his journey to St. Louis. We were his last stop of this epic bike tour. During his trip he encountered all the usual hazards that bicyclists run into - headwinds, heavy cold rains, hills, heat, humidity and lots of flat tires. During his trip however, he also encountered the generosity and support of people all across the nation. They welcomed him into their homes and gave him encouragement and support during his time on the road. Many of the major league teams also welcomed him to their stadium.

He used the tour to:
▪ Promote the unique aspects of baseball;
▪ Promote healthy and sustainable lifestyles, including bike riding;
▪ Promote the benefits of local food cooperatives;
▪ Promote the support of local food banks;
▪ Promote the personal and social benefits of volunteering.

Darren O'Donnell decided that Busch Stadium would be the last ballpark he would visit. St. Louis is home to his aunt, Helen Roder, and his cousin, Mike. Obviously wherever Darren went on his bike tour he received the attention of the national media. At September 25th's game he biked onto the warning track and got to throw out the first pitch with his cousin. At the same time he decided to share the spotlight with Lafayette Industries, and requested donations. Mike's uncle, Jim O'Donnell, worked very hard with the Cardinal PR group to make sure this happened. On the field with Darren and Mike were Mike's buddies from Lafayette, Jeff Hall, Darick Gaugh and Tim Gregerson, and our Board President, Fred Wark and our Executive Director, Rob Libera. 
