<u>Editorial note:</u> In light of the recent snowstorms and bitterly cold weather we have had, a number of folks have asked about how they find out if Lafayette Industries is open or not. We are running a memo from a December newsletter that should answer any questions you have.

EMERGENCY CLOSING PROCEDURES FOR LAFAYETTE INDUSTRIES EMPLOYEES

In the event of inclement weather or other emergencies that would require the workshop to be closed, Lafayette Industries' employees need to listen to radio station KMOX 1120 AM or watch KSDK-TV CHANNEL 5, FOX-TV

CHANNEL 2 or KMOV-TV CHANNEL 4. You may also check the following websites – www.ksdk.com, www.ksdk.com, and www.ksdk.com, or CALL-A-RIDE can be found on the same sources under Miscellaneous Closings.

Any announcement will state specifically that **LAFAYETTE WORK CENTER** (**WEST**) and **LAFAYETTE INDUSTRIES NORTH** are **CLOSED**. If both are listed it means that **NO** Lafayette employees should come to **either** work center that day.

- An announcement that OATS and / or CALL-A-RIDE will not be running **DOES NOT** mean that the work center is closed;
- An announcement that PARKWAY SCHOOLS or NORTH COUNTY SCHOOLS are closed **DOES NOT** mean that the work center is closed.
- If you do not see LAFAYETTE WORK CENTER (WEST) or LAFAYETTE INDUSTRIES NORTH listed as closed, you may still come to work via your own transportation. Lafayette Industries Staff will be on hand.

IMPORTANT: DURING BAD WEATHER, PRIVATE CARS OR GROUP HOME DRIVERS NEED TO CONFIRM THAT THE WORK CENTER IS OPEN AND STAFF ARE PRESENT BEFORE LEAVING THEIR WORKERS.

If the weather should turn inclement during working hours and OATS or CALL-A-RIDE requests an early pick up, we will dismiss those workers at that time and notify their emergency contacts. Please make sure to keep us up to date on emergency contact numbers.

Check the sources for mid-day closings, too. We will notify you of any change during the normal workday as soon as possible. You may call the office to see if your worker is being dismissed early, or to make arrangements to pick up your worker. The office number is (6736) 227-5666, x1100 for West and (636) 227-5666, x2101 for North. We will not dismiss early simply because inclement weather has been PREDICTED. Remember to make sure to have a plan in place in case of early dismissal.
