Did you know that just 16 minutes less of an individual's required sleep can become safety hazard? The March 22nd issue of this year's <u>Sleep Health</u> magazine published a study supporting this.

Karen Van Berkel, our sales manager, had been working on weeding when she had time. All efforts by everyone were appreciated.



Karen also took some time to give us some more information about the creatures that visit our garden. "Layette West's garden attracts 12 species of butterflies, including Monarchs, as well as hummingbirds and the clearwing hummingbird moth. The garden contains pollinator plants such as butterfly bush, purple cone flower, sage, lambs quarters, bear's britches, and speedwell. The tulip tree at the front of the side parking lot is also a great plant for sheltering and hosting birds and butterflies including the Viceroy, a Monarch mimic, which was seen last fall and this spring in the garden. Take a minute to enjoy the garden the next time you are here."
