MOBILE "ALERT" SYSTEM COMING TO LAFAYETTE

Fall is almost here and winter is just around the corner! In preparation for the upcoming snowy season, Lafayette is **changing how we contact all our employees and staff about weather closings, important schedule changes and any emergency alerts.** Starting later this year we are using a company called **Alert Media** to manage our emergency alert system. What this change means for you is if we encounter a day when we need to close due to weather or some other reason, all staff and employees and guardians / caregivers will get either a text message, an email or an automated voice message --- or all three if you choose! During the month of September we will be testing everyone's phone numbers and email addresses to make sure the numbers work and that we have accurate and up-to-date information. The oldest nighttime bicycle ride in the country, the St. Louis Moonlight Ramble, returned to downtown, Saturday, August 17th. Anticipating the countdown to the 10:00 pm start, thousands of excited cyclists lined Market Street, as the moon peeked through the Arch.

My daughter, Lafayette's Val Shaw, has ridden in the past 8 Rambles, with this year's being her most exciting because she had decked-out her bicycle with a long "tail" sticking 5 feet in

the air, wrapped in red lights, and wheel lights that became a solid light when turning.

Val started the ride with myself and nine others in our group. But when 3500 bicyclists all start at the same time, one quickly gets separated. Val, Dave Kovar and myself headed towards the Arch, turned at the Cardinal's Stadium and remained together the rest of the night completing the wild ride through the closed streets of downtown, the Grove, Forest Park, Forest Park trails, and many tunnels. Restaurant and bar patrons lined the streets and cheered us on. We completed the long course, 17 miles, by midnight and returned to the park venue across from City Hall and listened to the band until 1:30 a.m.

It was a great night, terrific weather and a wonderful ride. I highly recommend it. It is family-oriented, there is a short course of 6 miles, the long course and it is NOT a race. Just a fun bicycle ride with friendly people that occurs every August.
