# PIGEON PRIDE, LAFAYETTE PROUD



The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual and perhaps final KLIPSCH FAMILY PIGEON RACE took place on Saturday, Sept. 14<sup>th</sup> at the Klipsch family home to benefit Lafayette Industries. Pictured at left is Charlie Klipsch calling for the "release" of the pigeons. Charlie and Flo's daughter, Joyce, has worked at Lafayette for 29 years ago. What started out 2 years ago as a brainstorming idea to help Lafayette turned into the most unique support event of the year!

The weather was beautiful as over 50+ people gathered to anticipate the arrival of a dozen racing pigeons that were released from St. Clair, MO at approximately 10:00 a.m. Guesses and bets were made at to what exact time—down to the minute and second — the first pigeon would arrive and cross the threshold to the pigeon coop which was the finishing line — electronically recorded no less! At 11:01:15 a.m., the winner arrived to the cheers of the crowd.

Pigeons are the world's oldest domesticated bird, and during the course of history have made contributions of considerable importance to humanity, carrying vital messages when needed. Some have been decorated for their services. The Klipsch family has been raising and racing pigeons for over 100 years. Charlie has carried his family legacy on and is a recognized expert in the field. He is deeply devoted to his craft, and extremely devoted to 2 more things: his family, and Lafayette. Charlie took his concept and turned it into a community-wide awareness platform for our mission, and raised \$20,000 over these races to help Lafayette employ and train dedicated deserving adults who simply wanted a job to call their own.

Well, Charlie, you are Lafayette's "own"! We can't thank you, your family and friends for what you have done for us, and how you have "carried the message home" for Lafayette. We salute and honor you, and the Klipsch Family Pigeon Race will forever have a special place in Lafayette's history!






