TAX TIME IS COMING...



Starting February 10th and each Monday thereafter until finished, we will offer free tax preparation service for Lafayette employees, staff and immediate family members at the West office. Watch this newsletter for appointment scheduling information which will begin in mid-January. The service is sponsored by the AARP Tax Aide Foundation and the volunteer counselors are IRS certified. Federal and Missouri state tax returns are

completed as a package and filed electronically.

As your tax information begins to come in, keep it in a safe place and find last year's return to begin the file. Remember you will need a picture ID, income documents and your bank account number for direct refund deposit.

If you contribute to a "Missouri Achieving a Better Life Experience Program" (ABLE) account for a special-needs person make the contribution before December 31, 2019 and receive a 2019 Missouri income tax deduction. If you would like to learn more about the program go to www.moable.com.


